LITERATURE

THE TROPICAL FOREST AND GRASSLAND AREAS DRAINED BY THE AMAZON AND ORINOCO RIVERS SUSTAINED A HUNTING , FISHING AND GATHERING LIFESTYLE SUPPLEMENTED BY SWIDDEN FARMING . THIS VAST AREA OF THE AMAZONIAN REGION WAS INHABITED BY THREE MAIN TRIBAL GROUPS , THE GUARANI TUPI , THE ARAWAK OR MAIPURE , AND THE CARIB .

KNOWLEDGE OF METALS DID NOT REACH THESE PEOPLES BEYOND THE ANDES FOR HUNDREDS OF YEARS AFTER THE SPANISH CONQUEST, AND WEAPONS CONTINUED TO BE FASHIONED FROM HARDWOODS, BONE AND STONE. THE GUIANA WAR CLUB IS A MANS MOST POWERFUL AND ENDURING ACCOUTREMENT AND IS A MASCULINE SYMBOL USED FOR RITUAL WRESTLING AND STEREOTYPED BATTLES BETWEEN VISITORS FROM FRIENDLY VILLAGES. MORE SERIOUSLY IT IS USED IN REPRISAL FOR ADULTERY. THE BASKETRY - SHEATHED POMMEL MAINTAINS A GOOD GRIP AND THE HARDWOOD BLADE IS USED TO PIN THE ADVERSARY'S NECK TO THE GROUND WHILE THE CROWN OF HIS HEAD IS SLASHED TO THE BONE WITH A SPECIAL 'SCRATCHING KNIFE'. THE FLAT BLADE CAN BE USED TO INCAPACITATE A MAN BY KNOCKING HIS WIND OUT, OR THE SHARP END OF THE BLADE CAN BE DIRECTED AT THE VICTIM AND WILL EASILY SPLIT A MAN'S HEAD LIKE A MELON.
