THE SKILFUL SHAPING OF THE FACE AND ESPECIALLY THE EYES ACHIEVES A LIFELIKE DEPICTION OF THE TERROR OF A PRISONER, OR THE PRIDE OF A PRINCE, OR THE FATIGUE AND EXHAUSTION OF A WORKER. THE 'MOCHICA GAZE' IS ALWAYS EVIDENT AND IS THE MAIN FACTOR OF THE EXPRESSIVE POWER OF THESE ANCIENT VESSELS.
