## LITERATURE

THE LATE CLASSIC MAORI WARRIOR CARRIED A 'PATU' AND ALSO 'TAIAHA', A WEAPON MUCH LIKE A QUARTERSTAFF WELDED WITH BOTH HANDS IN A VARIETY OF THRUSTS, PARRIES AND FEINTS. ONE END IS FLATTENED TO A NARROW BLADE AND THE OTHER CARVED AS A DISTORTED DOUBLE FACED HEAD THE POINT REPRESENTING A TONGUE ISSUING FORTH IN THE TYPICAL MAORI GESTURE OF DEFIANCE. THEY OFTEN ALSO SERVED AS ORATORS' STAFFS.

ALL HIGHLY BORN MALES CARRIED 'TAIAHA' AS AN INSIGNIA OF RANK AND THERE ARE CONSEQUENTLY MANY EXAMPLES IN EXISTENCE TODAY. HOWEVER, THIS EXAMPLE HAS A FINE, DRY, UNTOUCHED ORIGINAL PATINA, AND HAS NOT BEEN VARNISHED OR POLISHED AS HAVE SO MANY OTHER EXAMPLES.
