'YARI' IS A TERM FOR A LONG SPEAR WITH A TRADITIONALLY MADE STEEL BLADE. THE 'MARTIAL ART' OF HANDLING AND WELDING A "YARI' IS REFERRED TO AS 'SŌJUTSU'. THE TRIANGULAR SPEAR HEAD 'SANKAKU YARI' HAS A POINT TERMINATING FROM A TRIANGULAR CROSS-SECTION. USED TO PENETRATE METAL ARMOUR, ITS EFFECTIVENESS WAS WITHOUT DOUBT.
