SIR ROBERT PEEL , PRIME MINISTER OF ENGLAND , AT THE 'MAKEANT MILL ,' HEYWOOD . THE MILL , WHICH WAS BUILT FOR
THE PEEL FAMILY IN 1780 IS SHOWN IN THE PICTURE . IT HAS SINCE BEEN REBUILT AND IS NOW KNOWN AS ROACH MILLS
. THE PORTRAIT WAS PAINTED BY SIR THOMAS LAWRENCE P.R.A ABOUT 1825 FOR SIR ROBERT PEEL , WHO GAVE IT TO
JAMES HOLMES , AND FROM THE LATTERS GRANDSON JAMES JONATHAN HOLMES IT CAME TO RICHARD HEAPE IN 1902 .'
THIS INTERESTING EARLY 19 TH CENTURY OIL DEPICTS A LANCASHIRE INDUSTRIAL MILL MANAGER WITH A SKIEN OF
BEST COTTON BETWEEN HIS HANDS , THE PRODUCT OF THE FACTORY SHOWN IN THE DISTANT LANDSCAPE . THE
PAINTING CLEARLY APPROVING OF THE TRUSTED EMPLOYEE OF THE GREAT INDUSTRIAL MAGNATE AND BRILLIANT
POLITICIAN OF THE TORY PARTY SIR ROBERT PEEL .
