THE PORTRAIT WAS PAINTED BY SIR THOMAS LAWRENCE P.R.A ABOUT 1825 FOR SIR ROBERT PEEL, WHO GAVE IT TO JAMES HOLMES, AND FROM THE LATTERS GRANDSON JAWES JONATHAN HOLMES IT CAME TO RICHARD HEAPE IN 1902.' THIS INTERESTING EARLY 19 TH CENTURY OIL DEPICTS A LANCASHIRE INDUSTRIAL MILL MANAGER WITH A SKIEN OF BEST COTTON BETWEEN HIS HANDS, THE PRODUCT OF THE FACTORY SHOWN IN THE DISTANT LANDSCAPE.
