THE HEAD OF MEDUSA IS REPRESENTED IN WORKS OF ART WITH A COUNTENANCE OF TOUCHING BEAUTY AND A WEALTH OF HAIR WREATHED WITH SNAKES. MYTHOLOGY STATES THAT SHE HAD BEEN A FAIR MAIDEN WHOSE LUXURIANT HAIR HAD BEEN TURNED BY ATHENE INTO SNAKES IN REVENGE FOR THE DESECRATION OF HER SANCTUARY. HER HEAD WAS CUT OFF BY PERSEUS AND WAS AFTER REGARDED AS A MEANS OF PROTECTION AGAINST ENCHANTMENT EITHER BY WORD OR DEED, AND THE SNAKE BECAME EMPLOYED AS A POWERFUL AMULET OFTEN CARVED ON GREEK AND ROMAN DECORATIVE FURNITURE AND ORNAMENTS.
