MADE WITH THE BONES OF ANIMALS USED FOR THEIR RATIONS THIS EXACT SCALE MODEL OF A FRENCH REVOLUTIONARY GUILLOTINE SHOWS THE GREAT SKILL OF THE PRISONERS OF WAR CARVING WITH LIMITED MATERIALS, AND GIVES THE IMPRESSION THAT TIME WAS NO OBJECT.

THE GUILLOTINE WAS THE INVENTION OF A FRENCH PHYSICIAN AND REVOLUTIONARY CALLED JOSEPH IGNACE
GUILLOTIN ( 1738 - 1814 ) . HE PROPOSED THAT THE CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY OF WHICH HE WAS A DEPUTY SHOULD USE
A DECAPITATING INSTRUMENT AS A MEANS OF EXECUTION . THIS WAS ADOPTED IN 1791 AND NAMED AFTER HIM,
ALTHOUGH A SIMILAR APPARATUS HAD BEEN USED EARLIER IN SCOTLAND, GERMANY AND ITALY.
