THIS SKILFULLY CARVED LEOPARD WAS MOST PROBABLY MADE IN MOZAMBIQUE AROUND THE TURN OF THE LAST CENTURY SPECIFICALLY FOR VISITING COLONIALS TO RETURN TO EUROPE WITH AS A REMINDER OF THEIR STAY. IT IS A REPRESENTATIVE EXAMPLE OF AN INDIGENOUS AFRICAN CULTURE SUCCESSFULLY ADAPTING TO AN OUTSIDE COMMERCIAL COLONIAL MARKET.
