LITERATURE

IN THE LATE 19 TH CENTURY THE SUB-ARCTIC CREE WERE HUNTERS AND FUR TRAPPERS, LIMING PRIMARILY OFF FISH AND GAME AND FOOD OBTAINED FROM THE HUDSON'S BAY COMPANY POSTS IN EXCHANGE FOR FURS. THEY TRAVELLED BY BIRCH BARK CANOES IN THE SUMMER, DOG SLED AND SNOWSHOES IN THE WINTER AND MOSTLY LIVED IN CONICAL OR DOMED WIGWAMS COVERED WITH TRADED CANVAS. AT THIS TIME THE HUNTERS STILL WORE NATIVE MOCCASINS, BUT THEY HUNTED WITH GUNS.
