THE BRUSH POT, KNOWN IN CHINESE AS 'BITONG', GRADUALLY SUPPLANTED OTHER METHODS OF STORING SCHOLARS WRITING BRUSHES FROM THE MID 16 TH CENTURY AND IS FOUND IN ALL THE DIFFERENT MATERIALS OF CERAMIC, LACQUER, JADE, BAMBOO AND IVORY USED BY THE MING AND QING DYNASTY CRAFTSMEN. HOWEVER, BAMBOO AND IVORY WITH THEIR NATURAL CIRCULAR SECTIONS ARE THE MOST OBMOUS MATERIALS FOR MAKING A BRUSH POT. LINES OF POETRY FREQUENTLY FORM PART OF THE DECORATIVE SCHEME ON CHINESE SCHOLARS OBJECTS AND ARE OFTEN THE MAIN MOTIF. THE SUBJECT OF THE POEM, MEANT TO INSPIRE THE SCHOLAR TO GREATER WORKS, IS USUALLY RELATED TO THE OBJECT ITSELF, AND IN THIS WAY THE POEM BECOMES AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE OBJECT AND NOT JUST MERE DECORATION.
