WHEN UNEARTHED IN CONTROLLED EXCAVATIONS THESE MACE HEADS ARE FOUND IN FUNERARY CONTEXTS WITH CARVED STONE 'METATES', FLAT STONE MORTARS (SEE: FINCH & CO CATALOGUE NO. 4 (ITEMNO. 9) FOR AN EXAMPLE), AND JADE AXE PENDANTS. THEY MARK ELITE BURIALS IN COSTA RICA AND WERE PROBABLY CEREMONIAL RATHER THAN FOR USE AS A WEAPON. THE VARIETY OF MOTIFS DEPICTED, INCLUDING SKULLS, OWLS, MONKEYS, BATS AND COYOTES MAY RELATE TO THEMBEING USED AS BADGES OF OFFICE, AND ALLUDING TO THE POWER ASSOCIATED WITH MILITARY PROWESS.
