THE TRADITIONAL PEAKED HAIRSTYLE WORN BY THIS FIGURE IS THAT OF A ZULU MARRIED WOMAN FROM KWA-ZULU NATAL, AT AROUND THE TURN OF THE 20 TH CENTURY. HOWEVER, IT IS SUPPOSED THAT THESE STAFFS WERE PRODUCED BY THE MIGRANT TSONGA CARVERS WORKING IN THE COLONY, THE MOST FAMOUS OF WHICH IS KNOWN AS THE 'BABOON MASTER', WHO MOST PROBABLY HAD A WORKSHOP IN WHICH OTHER SIMILAR WORKS WERE PRODUCED BY ASSISTANTS. IT IS ALSO POSSIBLE THAT THESE STAFFS WERE MADE BY DIFFERENT CRAFTSMEN WHO WERE IMITATING A SUCCESSFUL ARTIST. ALL OF THEM FOUND A READY MARKET IN SELLING TO THE EUROPEAN SOLDIERS EAGER FOR SOUVENIRS TO TAKE HOME FROM THE ANGLO ZULU WARS.
