THE TASK OF DIFFERENTIATING CLUBS FROM THE FIJI - TONGA - SAMOA AREA IS DIFFICULT . CLUBS WERE GAINED AS PRESTIGIOUS WAR TROPHIES AND EXCHANGED FROM ISLAND TO ISLAND , AND THE THREE GROUPS HAVE BEEN IN PERIODIC CONTACT FOR AT LEAST 3000 YEARS .

HOWEVER, STEVEN PHELPS MAINTAINS (THE JAMES HOOPER COLLECTION) THAT THE BUTTS OF 'APA? APA!' CLUBS REVEAL A FAVOURED TONGAN FORM OF BUTT LUG, ITS SIDES NOT REACHING THE FULL WIDTH OF THE CLUB SHAFT. ON SAMOAN CLUBS THEY TOOK THE FORM OF A BROAD PIERCED TRIANGLE, THE SIDES OF WHICH SLOPED DOWN TO THE FULL WIDTH OF THE HANDLE.

TONGAN 'APA? APAI' CLUBS WERE ALMOST CERTAINLY INTRODUCED TO SAMOA WHERE THEY BEGAN TO BE MADE AND WERE CALLED 'UATOGI.'
