LITERATURE

A STAYBUSK IS A STIFFENER THAT WAS INSERTED INTO A LADIES CORSET OR CORSAGE. IT HAD BECOME A CUSTOM IN THE 18 TH AND 19 TH CENTURIES FOR SAILORS, ESPECIALLY THOSE ON BOARD WHALING SHIPS, TO MAKE THESE TO PRESENT TO THEIR SWEETHEARTS AS LOVE TOKENS.

THE EARLIEST KNOWN STAYBUSK IS MADE OF WOOD AND DATED 1660 AND CAN BE SEEN IN BIRMINGHAM CITY MUSEUM IN THE PINTO COLLECTION. ANOTHER DATED 1675 IS IN THE VICTORIA AND ALBERT MUSEUM, LONDON. THE MAJORITY WERE MADE BETWEEN 1760 AND 1800, THE DICTATES OF FASHION EVENTUALLY RENDERING THEM OBSOLETE.

THIS EXAMPLE HAS THE INITIALS H.D. & A.D. AND WAS PROBABLY MADE TO COMMEMORATE A MARRIAGE.
