LITERATURE

ALTHOUGH IT MAY BE USED OCCASIONALLY FOR MAGICAL PURPOSES, A MESSAGE STICK WAS USED ESSENTIALLY AS AN AIDE-MÉMOIRE AND AS A GUARANTEE OF SAFE CONDUCT THROUGH FOREIGN TERRITORY. A PARTICULAR STICK DOES NOT CONVEY ANY FORM OF COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THE SENDER AND RECEIVER AS THE ABORIGINES HAD NO SYSTEM OF WRITING, BUT IS A GUARANTEE OF THE INTEGRITY OF THE MESSENGER AND THE MESSAGE. THUS THE ENGRAVED DESIGNS SERVED AS A FORM OF PERSONAL SEAL AND WAS OFTEN USED AS A SIGN OF GOOD FAITH IN TRADING TRANSACTIONS.

'CORROBOREES' WERE NON-RELIGIOUS CELEBRATIONS TO WHICH MEMBERS OF OTHER TRIBES COULD BE INVITED BY MEANS OF MESSAGE STICKS. THE INCISED PICTOGRAPHIC SYMBOLS SERVED BOTH AS AN INVITATION TO THE INTERTRIBAL CEREMONIES AND AS PROTECTION TO THE CARRIER OF THE STICK WHEN IN ALIEN TERRITORY.
