THE SWISS COTTAGE OR COTTAGE ORNÉ WAS THE EMBODIMENT OF AN ARISTOCRATS FANTASY OF THE JOYS OF RURAL LIFE AND THE COUNTRYSIDE. IT IS A HIGHPOINT OF THE 'PICTURESQUE' MOVEMENT, AND DERIVED FROM THE FRENCH IDEA OF THE 'FERME ORNÉE', A KIND OF PLEASURE FARM FOR WORLD WEARY ROYALTY AND COURT FOLLOWERS. IN ENGLAND AND IRELAND IT BECAME A ROMANTIC INTERPRETATION OF A PEASANTS COTTAGE IN A RURAL SETTING AND IS REVEALING OF EARLY 19 TH CENTURY SOCIETY'S DEVELOPING SENSITIVITY TOWARDS NATURE. JOHN NASH WAS THE GREAT ENGLISH MASTER OF THE COTTAGE ORNÉ. HAVING BUILT THE ROYAL PAMLION IN BRIGHTON HE WENT ON TO BUILD BLAISE HAWLET, NEAR BLAISE CASTLE, BRISTOL AND THE SWISS COTTAGE AT CAHIR, IRELAND AS WELL AS OTHERS. HE PIONEERED ENGLISH AND IRISH TASTE IN THE COTTAGE ORNÉ.
