

## LITERATURE

SLING STONES WERE POPULAR AS WEAPONS AND TOGETHER WITH CLUBS AND SPEARS WERE USED IN WARFARE BETWEEN, AND SOMETIMES WITHIN, TRIBES ON THE COOK ISLANDS.

BASALT STONES WERE EXCLUSIVELY USED ON RARATONGA. KNOWN AS 'TOKA MAKA' THEY WERE THROWN FROM PLAITED COIR POUCHES AT GREAT SPEED AND IN PRACTISED HANDS WERE A VERY EFFECTIVE WEAPON.
