## LITERATURE

NOT RELIABLY SEEN SINCE 1844 THE GREAT AUK, LIKE THE ILL-FATED DODO, HAS BECOME ONE OF THE GREAT ICONS OF EXTINCTION. IN THE 17 TH CENTURY THE DANE 'OLE WORM OBTAINED A LIVING BIRD AND KEPT IT ALIVE FOR A WHILE IN HIS CABINET OF CURIOSITIES 'THE MUSEUM WORMANUM IN COPENHAGEN. THIS CABINET WAS CONFINED TO COLLECTIONS OF NATURALIA. A PORTRAIT OF HIS BIRD WAS DRAWN AND IS ONE OF THE EARLIEST KNOWN REPRESENTATIONS OF THE GREAT AUK.

THIS 19 TH CENTURY WATERCOLOUR WAS MOST PROBABLY PAINTED AS A RESPONSE TO THE NEWSPAPER REPORT OF 1894; 600 GUINEA'S WAS A VAST SUMBY LATE 19 TH CENTURY STANDARDS FOR A STUFFED BIRD!. THE NEAREST SIMILAR ILLUSTRATION TO THIS WATERCOLOUR IS A HAND COLOURED LITHOGRAPH BY H. MEYER INCLUDED IN HIS 'ILLUSTRATIONS OF BRITISH BIRDS 1835 - 41'. LIKE OTHERS MEYER CONTINUED TO BELIEVE IN THE SURVIVAL OF THE GREAT AUK LONG AFTER 1844.
