LITERATURE

COMMONLY FOUND IN THE CHALK AND LIMESTONE OF WESTERN EUROPE, FLINT AND CHERT ARE OPAQUE
CHALCEDONY, USUALLY DULL GREY TO GREY BLACK IN COLOUR WHICH BREAK WITH A PRONOUNCED CONCHOIDAL
FRACTURE GIVING SHARP EDGES, A PROPERTY THAT WAS EXPLOITED BY PRE-HISTORIC MAN IN MAKING FLINT AXES AND
OTHER IMPLEMENTS. FLINT FREQUENTLY CONTAINS FOSSILS.
