LITERATURE

BASTET WAS THE PROTECTRESS OF THE HOUSE AND THE DAUGHTER OF THE SUN GOD AND WAS PARTICULARLY POPULAR AS A VOTIVE IMAGE.

IN ANCIENT EGYPT CATS WERE IMPORTANT BOTH AS DOMESTIC PETS AND AS THE SYMBOL OF THE GODDESS, THEIR BODIES OFTEN BEING ELABORATELY MUMMIFIED. THE EARLIEST REMAINS OF A CAT WERE FOUND IN A TOMB AT THE PREDYNASTIC SITE OF MOSTAGEDDA SUGGESTING THAT THE EGYPTIANS WERE ALREADY KEEPING CATS AS PETS IN THE LATE 4TH MILLENNIUM BC.
