THE LACK OF POCKETS IN NATIVE GARMENTS HELPS TO EXPLAIN THE DEVELOPMENT OF A VARIETY OF BAGS AND POUCHES THAT WERE WORN SUSPENDED FROM THE NECK, SHOULDER OR BELT. IN EARLIER TIMES THESE LONG BELT POUCHES WERE MADE FROM THE WHOLE SKINS OF SMALL ANIMALS.
