IT COULD ALSO BE A PEACE OFFERING AS RECORDED BY LAURENCE STERNE IN HIS 'SENTIMENTAL JOURNEY'. HAWING ONCE REFUSED AN APPEAL FOR ALMS FROM A FRANCISCAN MONK, ON THEIR SECOND MEETING HE TRY'S TO MAKE AMENDS; 'HAVING A SNUFF BOX IN HIS HAND, PRESENTED IT OPEN TO ME-YOU SHALL TASTE MINE - SAID I, PULLING OUT MY BOX, WHICH WAS A SMALL TORTOISE ONE, AND PUTTING IT INTO HIS HAND 'TIS MOST EXCELLENT, SAID THE MONK; THEN DO ME A FAVOUR, I REPLIED, TO ACCEPT OF THE BOX AND ALL, AND WHEN YOU TAKE A PINCH OUT OF IT, SOMETIMES RECOLLECT IT WAS THE PEACE OFFERING OF A MAN WHO ONCE USED YOU UNKINDLY, BUT NOT FROM HIS HEART'.
