NIAS IS THE BIGGEST OF 131 SMALLER ISLANDS THAT LIE OFF THE WESTERN COAST OF SUMATRA, INDONESIA. BEARING A RESEMBLANCE TO THE DAYAK SHIELDS OF BORNEO, THESE WAR SHIELDS ARE USED BY THE NIAS IN THE SOUTH OF THE ISLAND. THESE SHIELDS ARE ALSO USED BY YOUNG WARRIORS IN A WAR DANCE AND A MANHOOD RITUAL THAT INVOLVES ACROBATICALLY LEAPING OVER THE EDGE OF TWO METRE STONE TOWERS IN ORDER TO PROVE THEIR READINESS TO TAKE A WIFE.
