LITERATURE

EACH ON A TURNED STONE SOCLE, THESE ATTRACTIVE AND VERY DECORATIVE MARBLE SCULPTURES WERE ONCE HOUSES IN A NICHE AS EVIDENCED BY AN IRON RING SET INTO THE REVERSE AND BY THE ROUGH FINISHING ON THE REVERSE OF EACH HEAD.

THEY MAY WELL REPRESENT A PAIR OF PORTRAITS COMMISSIONED ON THE OCCASION OF THE SITTERS' BETROTHAL OR MARRIAGE. AT THIS TIME IT WAS A POPULAR FANCY OR CONCEIT TO HAVE ONE'S PORTRAIT SCULPTED IN THE GUISE OF ANCIENT DIVINES SUCH AS THESE LOVERS MELEAGER AND ATALANTA. GABRIEL GRUPELLO 1644-1730 WAS A PUPIL OF ARTUS QUELLINUS THE ELDER AND WORKED IN SEVERAL EUROPEAN CENTRES, INCLUDING BRUSSELS AND

DÍ¼SSELDORF. THE FACIAL CHARACTERISTICS OF THESE TWO BUSTS COMPARE
STYLISTICALLY TO SEVERAL WORKS BY GRUPELLO ESPECIALLY TO THAT OF A
FULL-LENGTH FIGURE OF GALATEA BY HIM IN THE PARK OF THE PALACE AT
SCHWETZINGEN.
