EACH ON A TURNED STONE SOCLE, THESE ATTRACTIVE AND VERY DECORATIVE MARBLE SCULPTURES WERE ONCE HOUSES IN A NICHE AS EVIDENCED BY AN IRON RING SET INTO THE REVERSE AND BY THE ROUGH FINISHING ON THE RESERVE OF EACH HEAD.

THEY MAY WELL REPRESENT A PAIR OF PORTRAITS COMMISSIONED ON THE OCCASION OF THE SITTERS' BETROTHAL OR MARRIAGE. AT THIS TIME IT WAS A POPULAR FANCY OR CONCEIT TO HAVE ONE'S PORTRAIT SCULPTED IN THE GUISE OF ANCIENT DIVINES SUCH AS THESE LOVERS MELEAGER AND ATALANTA GABRIEL GRUPELLO 1644-1730 WAS A PUPIL OF ARTUS QUELLINUS THE ELDER AND WORKED IN SEVERAL EUROPEAN CENTRES, INCLUDING BRUSSELS AND DͼSSELDORF. THE FACIAL CHARACTERISTICS OF THESE TWO BUSTS COMPARE STYLISTICALLY TO SEVERAL WORKS BY GRUPELLO ESPECIALLY TO THAT OF A FULL-LENGTH FIGURE OF GALATEA BY HIM IN THE PARK OF THE PALACE AT SCHWETZINGEN.
