OTTOMAN DINING TABLES WERE SET WITH SPOONS OF VARIOUS SHAPES AND SIZES FOR THE MANY DIFFERENT COURSES. THERE WERE SPECIAL SPOONS FOR RICE, FRUIT SHERBETS AND JAWS AS WELL AS ALL KINDS OF SOUP SPOONS OFTEN MADE FROM GOLD OR SILVER. THE SHERBET SPOONS WERE MADE FROM A VARIETY OF EXOTIC AND PRECIOUS MATERIALS WITH THE SPOONS MADE FOR THE SULTANS USE AT THE TOPKAPI PALACE IN ISTANBUL EXQUISITELY ENAMELLED AND DECORATED WITH JEWELS. SWEET TREATS SUCH AS COLD FRUIT SHERBET WERE A PART OF DAILY LIFE FOR THE OTTOMANS AND WERE OFTEN ENJOYED BY THE LADIES OF THE HAREM.
