IN THE SOLOMON ISLANDS THE BONITO, A PREDATORY FISH RELATED TO THE TUNA IS AN IMPORTANT SOURCE OF FOOD. THE PRESENCE OF A SHOAL IS INDICATED BY SEA BIRDS WHICH FOLLOW THE SMALL FISH ON WHICH THE BONITO FEED. THE BONITO ARE CAUGHT WITH UN-BAITED SPINNING HOOKS THAT ARE TOWED BEHIND CANOES, AS THE BONITO MISTAKE THESE SHELL HOOKS FOR SMALL FISH.
