## LITERATURE

COQUILLAS ARE THE NUTS OF THE ATTALEA FUNIFERA PALMTREE WHICH GROWS EXTENSIVELY IN SWAMPY GROUND ALONG THE EASTERN SIDE OF SOUTH AMERICA THEY WERE FIRST INTRODUCED TO WESTERN EUROPE IN THE MID 16TH CENTURY AND WERE VERY POPULAR FOR CARWING INTO SMALL OBJECTS. THE OILY NATURE OF THE COQUILLA NUT MAKES IT IDEAL FOR KEEPING SNUFF IN GOOD CONDITION WITHOUT IT DRYING OUT. IN THE 17TH CENTURY SNUFF FLASKS OR BOTTLES WERE USED IN ARISTOCRATIC CIRCLES, KEPT IN THE POCKET, AND FILLED BY MEANS OF A SMALL FUNNEL THROUGH THE SPOUT AT THE TOP.
