FISHING IS A MALE OCCUPATION IN THE SOLOMON ISLANDS WHICH IS PRACTISED BY TROLLING OR SPINNING THE UN-BAITED HOOK FROM BEHIND A MOVING CANOE. BONITO ARE BOTH ECONOMICALLY AND RITUALLY THE MOST IMPORTANT FISH IN THE SOLOMON ISLANDS THAT ARE CAUGHT WITH HOOKS SUCH AS THESE.
