PORTRAIT PENDANTS WERE POPULAR AND THE FASHION FOR CARVED PORTRAITS SEEMS TO HAVE BEEN BEGUN BY THE NATURALISTICALLY COLOURED MINIATURE WAX PORTRAITS OF INTRICATE WORKMANSHIP THAT WERE INTRODUCED AS A NOVELTY TO THE COURTS OF EUROPE DURING THE 16TH CENTURY.
