THIS CURIOUS BASKET WOULD HAVE TAKEN MANY WEEKS TO FORM, GROWING LAYER UPON LAYER OF ALUM CRYSTALS
AROUND A WIREWORK FRAME VERY GRADUALLY.

BEFORE THE ADVENT OF CHEMICAL DYES ALUM WAS AN IMPORTANT COMPOUND USED MAINLY FOR FIXING DYES IN
LEATHER. ALUM IS A COLOURLESS ASTRINGENT COMPOUND, WHICH IS A HYDRATED DOUBLE SULPHATE OF ALUMINIUM
AND POTASSIUM, AND IN THE 19TH CENTURY ALUM WAS AN EXPENSIVE COMMODITY.
