ANCIENT ROMAN HEADS CAN OFTEN BE SEEN ON 17TH OR 18TH CENTURY SHOULDERS AMONGST COUNTRY HOUSE COLLECTIONS. INDEED THE EARL OF PEMBROKE FILLED WILTON HOUSE NEAR SALISBURY WITH MANY SUCH BUSTS AND HEADS, SOME OF WHICH STILL REMAIN ON PUBLIC DISPLAY.
