LITERATURE

CLOTTED OR SOUR MILK CALLED 'AMASI' WAS A BASIC FOOD IN EVERY ZULU HOMESTEAD. CHILDREN ATE THE CURDS WITH THEIR HANDS, BUT ADULTS WOULD USE A PERSONAL CARVED WOODEN SPOON, WHICH WAS KEPT IN A WOVEN GRASS POUCH. THESE 'IZIMPONTSHI' WERE TRADITIONALLY GIVEN AS ENGAGEMENT GIFTS.
