THE CARVING OF THIS 'BUGBEAR' COCONUT FLASK IS OF EXCEPTIONAL QUALITY AND PROBABLY DEPICTS A SAILOR OR
CAPTAIN'S QUEST TO MAKE HIS FORTUNE FROM A LONG SEA VOYAGE. COCONUT FLASKS WERE MOST OFTEN CARVED BY
SAILORS VISITING THE TROPICS AND EXAMPLES CAN BE FOUND ORIGINATING FROM SOUTH AMERICA, MEXICO AND THE
POLYNESIAN ISLANDS.
