SNUFF TAKING WAS A COMMUNAL ACTIVITY AMONGST THE PEOPLES OF SOUTH AFRICA AND MEMBERS OF A FAMILY GROUP, OR FRIENDS MEETING, WOULD IMMEDIATELY TAKE A PINCH OF SNUFF BEFORE ANY DISCUSSION OR ACTIVITY COULD BEGIN. SNUFF FLASKS WERE NOT JUST REGARDED AS MERE CONTAINERS; THEY WERE SEEN AS OBJECTS OF PERSONAL ADORNMENT AND OFTEN WORN AS DECORATIVE ACCESSORIES TO ENHANCE THE COSTUME OF THE OWNER. THEY WERE THEREFORE CAREFULLY AND BEAUTIFULLY MADE.
