LITERATURE

THIS MASK WAS PURCHASED BY HALLINAN FROM THE 'KUKURAI' OR HEREDITARY CHIEFTAIN OF YASA VILLAGE ON MANAM ISLAND IN THE EARLY 1960'S. HE STATED THAT THIS TYPE OF MASK WAS MADE IN 3 VILLAGES: YASA, KAKULUMA AND BILIAU AND THAT IT WAS CALLED 'LAPUN' OR OLD MAN IN PIDGIN ENGLISH. WHEN IN USE THE WEARER OF THE MASK WAS MEANT TO FRIGHTEN THE PEOPLE WITH SPEARS PRIOR TO THE 'SINGSING' CELEBRATION. MANAM ISLAND LIES JUST OFF THE RAMU ISLAND AREA COASTLINE AND ITS ART FORM IS RELATED TO THE RAMU STYLE. THE MASK IS MOST PROBABLY A REPRESENTATION OF AN IMPORTANT CLAN ANCESTOR.
