'OLD RUTH', 'OLD MIKE', 'NEW MACKEREL' AND 'FRESH SAUSAGES' ABOVE A CARVING OF A STRING OF FOUR SAUSAGES.

IT COULD HAVE BEEN USED AS A CUDGEL, AND FOR CARRYING A TRAVELER'S BELONGINGS TIED IN A BUNDLE BOUND TO THE CROOK OF THE STICK, BUT IT MAY HAVE HAD NO OTHER ORIGINAL FUNCTION THAN TO OCCUPY THE MAKER AND THEN TO ENTERTAIN THE OBSERVER.
