THESE PAINTINGS ARE THE FOLK ART OF THE BRITISH ISLES, AND PROVIDE US WITH A GLIMPSE OF A GENUINELY RURAL PAST. WE ARE GIVEN A VIEW OF 18TH CENTURY COUNTRY LIFE THAT IS UNTAINTED BY THE GRAND TOUR AND THE CONSTRAINTS OF ORDERED PERSPECTIVE. THIS EXAMPLE OF A 'FARM-SCAPE' CONTAINS FIGURES PAINTED AS ISOLATED PROFILES, WHICH IS TYPICAL OF THE NAIVE ART OF THE PERIOD, AND IT WAS MOST PROBABLY PAINTED BY AN ITINERANT ARTIST OR 'LIMNER'.
