COMBINATION KNIFE PISTOLS WITH FOLDING BLADES WERE POPULAR WITH VICTORIAN GENTLEMEN IN ENGLAND IN THE MID-19TH CENTURY AS A MEANS OF SELF-DEFENCE. THEY WERE OFTEN ALSO USED BY SAILORS AS PROTECTION WHEN ASHORE IN FOREIGN PORTS. MADE BY UNWIN & RODGERS OF SHEFFIELD THEY USED BLACK POWDER AND WERE SOLD IN VARIOUS SMALL CALIBRES.
