IN THEIR EXTREME SIMPLIFICATION, OFTEN VERGING ON PURE ABSTRACTION, EVERY TRACE OF SENTIMENTALITY AND HUMANITY HAS BEEN SHUNNED. IT IS ASSUMED THAT THEY WERE A HIGHLY WARLIKE PEOPLE BECAUSE OF THE FORMALISTIC RIGOUR AND WITHDRAWN TACITURNITY OF THEIR ART.
