DURING THE RENAISSANCE AROMATIC SPICED AND SWEETENED WINES WERE DRUNK IN QUANTITY THROUGHOUT THE DAY EVERYWHERE IN EUROPE. ONE OF THE MOST FAVOURED WAS CALLED HIPPOCRAS, BOTH RED AND WHITE WINE WHICH WAS SWEETENED WITH HONEY OR SUGAR CANDY AND SPICES SUCH AS NUTWEG AND CLOVES. IN 1576 GEORGE CASCOYNE IN HIS 'A DELICATE DIET' DISPARAGINGLY WROTE 'YEA WINE OF IT SELFE IS NOT SUFFICIENT BUT SUGAR, LIMONS AND SUNDRY SORTES OF SPICES MUST BE DROWNED THEREIN. TO MINISTER WATER UNTO OUR VAINE DELIGHTS AND TO BE QUITE OURSELVES WITH THE BAITE WHICH DRONKENNESSE DOTH THEREIN LAY FOR US.'
