THE TURKS-HEAD KNOT AS WELL AS BEING DECORATIVE WAS ALSO VERY PRACTICAL WHERE A LARGE KNOT WAS
REQUIRED ON BOARD SHIP. WHEN WORKED WITH A LONG-LINE THE KNOT WILL FORM A TURBAN AND SO BECAME
KNOWN AS THE 'TURKSHEAD'. THE ENDLESS KNOT, WITH NO SEAMS OR VISIBLE BEGINNING OR END WAS TO THE SAILOR
AN ALLEGORY OF LOVE AND SO BECAME A SYMBOL OF INTERDEPENDENCE AND OF MARRIAGE OR UNION.
