LITERATURE

USED BY KUBA WOMEN TO POUND FOOD FOR CEREMONIAL OCCASIONS, THESE PESTLES ARE FASHIONED AND PATINATED BY DECADES OF USE. THEY ARE PROBABLY EMBLEMATIC OF A POWERFUL ANCESTRAL HUNTER, AND HAVING AMULETIC PROPERTIES, THE PESTLES ARE RITUALLY HANDED DOWN THROUGH THE FEMALE LINE AND REGARDED BY EACH GENERATION AS STATUS IMBUED OBJECTS.
