CARVED FROM A SINGLE PIECE OF OAK THE ARCHER WEARS A CLOSE FITTING COAT OF CHAIN MAIL BENEATH A THIGH LENGTH JERKIN TIGHTENED WITH A BELT, FLARING FROM THE HIPS. ON HIS HEAD A CONICAL HEADPIECE. HIS KNEES COVERED BY PAINTED CLOSED HINGED PLATE GREAVES.

IT HAS BEEN SUGGESTED THAT THIS SECULAR FIGURE WAS A DEVICE INTENDED TO CREATE AN ILLUSION. PLACED UPON THE BATTLEMENTS OF A CASTLE SCULPTURES SUCH AS THIS SUPPLEMENTED THE VISUAL DISPLAY OF ARMED RESISTANCE TO THE ENEMY.
