## LITERATURE

COQUILLA'S ARE THE NUTS OF THE 'ATTALEA FUNIFERA', A PALM TREE WHICH IS CALLED 'PIASSABA' IN BRAZIL AND WHICH ALSO PROVIDES A TOUGH FIBRE USED IN THE MAKING OF BROOMS. IT GROWS IN SWAWPY GROUND OR PARTIALLY FLOODED LAND EXTENSIVELY DOWN THE EASTERN SIDE OF SOUTH AMERICA. COQUILLA NUTS WERE FIRST SEEN IN EUROPE IN THE MID 16TH CENTURY AND WERE USED TO MAKE SMALL CARVED OR TURNED OBJECTS AND BOXES UNTIL THE END OF THE 19TH CENTURY. THE OILY NATURE OF THE NUT MAKES IT IDEAL FOR KEEPING THE SNUFF MOIST AND IN GOOD CONDITION.
