LITERATURE

THE FLUTE, WHICH IS USED TO MESMERISE THE SNAKES, IS CALLED A 'PUNGI' AND IS A TYPE OF FOLK CLARINET THAT ORIGINATED IN THE MIDDLE EAST. IT IS MADE FROM A DRIED BOTTLE GOURD OR COCONUT AND HAS TWO REEDS OR BAMBOO TUBES, ONE FOR THE MELODY AND ONE FOR THE DRONE, WHICH ARE PLAYED BY A PRACTISED METHOD OF CIRCULAR BREATHING SO THAT THE HAUNTING AND HYPNOTISING MELODIES ARE PLAYED TO THE SNAKES WITHOUT A PAUSE.
