KNOWN AS THE 'DEATHS HEAD' CARVED IVORIES OF THE HUMAN SKULL WERE POPULAR IN BAROQUE GERMANY AS CONTEMPLATIVE REMINDERS OF THE TRANSIENCE OF EARTHLY LIFE. HOWEVER, THERE WAS ALSO A RISING SCIENTIFIC INTEREST IN HUMAN ANATOMY, SO A CAREFULLY CARVED IVORY MODEL OF A SKULL BECAME A 'MUST HAVE' FOR A COLLECTORS KUNSTKAMMER.
