MADE TO BE WORN AS PENDANTS FROM SINNET CORD SUSPENDED THROUGH STONE DRILLED HOLES TO EACH END THESE CHEST ORNAMENTS HAD A PROFOUND CEREMONIAL SIGNIFICANCE ON THE PACIFIC ISLAND OF FIJI. WORN ONLY BY CHIEFS AND MEN OF RANK THEY WERE IMPORTANT RITUAL EXCHANGE ITEMS AT DYNASTIC GATHERINGS SUCH AS WEDDINGS.
