IN THE LATE 19TH CENTURY THE NORWEGIANS INVENTED AN EXPLOSIVE KILLING HEAD FOR HARPOONS AND THESE BECAME UNIVERSALLY USED BY THE ARCTIC WHALERS. THEY WERE FIRED FROM HARPOON GUNS MOUNTED ON A SWIVEL IN THE BOW OF A WHALEBOAT AND WHEN THE HARPOON HEAD ENTERED THE WHALE FAR ENOUGH A MECHANISM WENT OFF THAT TRIGGERED AN EXPLOSION. THESE HARPOON HEADS MADE ICE WHALING IN ARCTIC WATERS MUCH MORE FEASIBLE BECAUSE WHEN AN ORDINARY HARPOON STRUCK THE WHALE IT WOULD OFTEN DISAPPEAR UNDER THE ICE, NEVER TO BE FOUND. THE EXPLOSIVE DEVICE KILLED THE WHALE BEFORE IT COULD SWIM UNDER THE ICE.
